September Facts

September is named from the Latin word 'septem' meaning 7th. This is because it was the 7th month in the early Roman calendar.

Did you know that nothing whatsoever happens in British history between 3 and 13 September 1752?

The Anglo Saxons called it 'Gerst monath' (Barley Month) because it was the month they harvested the barley to make their favourite drink - Barley Brew. They also called it Haefest monath (harvest month).

At 1am on 2 September 1666 the Great Fire of London started in Pudding Lane. What started as a small small fire in a bakers shop raged for four days, destroying two thirds of the City: 13,200 houses, 430 streets and 89 churches. Only 6 deaths were recorded.

A reminder to everyone that this year's Suffolk Historic Churches Trust Ride and Stride event is to take place on Saturday 11th September from 9am until 5pm.


